

***Climate Peril* Wins 6th International Book Awards in Science**

Climate Peril: The Intelligent Reader's Guide to Understanding the Climate Crisis (Northbrae Books, 2014) by John J. Berger, Ph.D., has won the 2015 International Book Awards for Science. This year's awards, hosted by USA Book News, attracted entries from authors and publishers all around the world.

Climate Peril is a *Scientific American* recommended book. Professor Tim Flannery, the Australian climate expert and best-selling author, calls *Climate Peril*, "By far the best overview of climate science and its implications for our planet that I've ever read."

Climate Peril has an introduction by world-renowned scientists Dr. Paul and Anne Ehrlich of Stanford, and has a foreword by Dr. Ben Santer of Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change.

Climate Peril was also entered into the 2015 Benjamin Franklin Awards competition where a judge cited ***Climate Peril*** as, "probably the most important environmental book that has been written in many years. . . ."

The book underscores the unprecedented urgency of the climate crisis, providing detailed revelations about our proximity to irreversible climate tipping points. ***Climate Peril*** also illuminates the grave harm climate change is now doing to human health, the economy, national security, the oceans, other ecosystems, and biodiversity. Not surprisingly, people in nineteen of forty countries surveyed now cite climate change as their number one issue of concern, according to a recent study by the Pew Research Center.

Students have found that ***Climate Peril*** makes important findings of climate science easily accessible and helps them better understand the complexities of climate change and the climate threat while pointing toward solutions.
